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**BY-LAWS**

**6. Tender Social Services Relief Fund (SSRF) Phase 2-03 Nelson Street Fence Project, Pembroke, Ontario [Strategic Plan Goal #2]**

**Recommendation:** THAT the Community Services Committee recommends that County Council approve that Tender SSRF Phase 2-03 be awarded to BalPro Construction (o/a 2636189 Ontario) Brampton, to supply and install additional fencing of 24 units at 435-481 Nelson Street, Pembroke Ontario in the amount of \$270,006.23 plus HST,; AND FURTHER THAT County Council pass a By-law to Authorize Execution of the Contract.

**Background**

Renfrew County Housing Corporation issued a request for tender to supply and install additional fencing at the townhomes consisting of 24 units located on 435 – 481 Nelson Street. Tenders were received until 2:00 p.m., October 13, 2021. This was the third time for tendering and two quotes were received.

Funding is through the Social Services Relief Fund 2. As per the SSRF guidelines, this project was to be completed by December 31, 2021. However, challenges with obtaining quotes delayed this project. The Ministry of Municipal Affairs and Housing (MMAH) is currently reviewing an extension request to allow for this work to be completed in 2022 and a request to reallocate funds in the SSRF 2 to cover the additional costs.

Tenders were received and the results submitted are as follows:

All amounts exclude 13% HST.

In accordance with the County of Renfrew Policy GA-01 for the Procurement of Goods & Services, competitive tenders with results greater than \$150,000 require approval from County Council.

Procurement of the services included in this tender, followed the requirements set out in Policy GA-01 – Procurement of Goods & Services.

Attached as Appendix I is a by-law for the execution of Tender SSRF Phase 2-03 Nelson Street Fence Project, Pembroke, Ontario

### **Financial Implications**

The County of Renfrew received \$194,880.49 from the Social Services Relief Fund (SSRF) Phase 2. This project is to be funded in part by this fund, with any/all shortages covered and accounted for within the Renfrew County Housing Corporation (RCHC) 2022 budget as this work is to enhance RCHC properties.

**BY-LAW NUMBER 143-21**

**A BY-LAW FOR THE EXECUTION OF TENDER SSRF PHASE 2-03, NELSON STREET FENCE PROJECT, PEMBROKE, ONTARIO**

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WHEREAS under Sections 8, 9 and 11 of the Municipal Act, 2001, S.O. 2001, c.25, as amended, the Municipal Corporation of the County of Renfrew has the authority to pass by-laws to enter into contracts for the purpose of renovations of County of Renfrew property;

AND WHEREAS public tenders were requested to supply and install additional fencing of 24 units at 435-481 Nelson Street, Pembroke, Ontario under Tender SSRF Phase 2-03 in accordance with County of Renfrew Corporate Policy GA-01 Procurement of Goods and Services;

AND WHEREAS the tender submitted by BalPro Construction (o/a 2636189 Ontario), Brampton, Ontario was reviewed and accepted by the Community Services Committee.

NOW THEREFORE the Council of the Corporation of the County of Renfrew hereby enacts:

1. That the Council of the County of Renfrew approve of the awarding of Tender SSRF Phase 2-03 to supply and install additional fencing of 24 units at 435-481 Nelson Street as submitted by BalPro Construction (o/a 2636189 Ontario), Brampton, Ontario in the amount of \$270,006.23 plus HST.
2. That the Warden and Clerk be empowered to do and execute all things, papers and documents necessary to the execution of the said contract.
3. That this By-law shall come into force and take effect upon the passing thereof.

READ a second time this 24<sup>th</sup> day of November 2021.

READ a third time and finally passed this 24<sup>th</sup> day of November 2021.
