4. Speeding and Pedestrian Crossing Concerns – Township of Killaloe, Hagarty and Richards

On September 5, 2023, Operations Committee Chair Glenn Doncaster and County of Renfrew staff consisting of Craig Kelley, Chief Administrative Officer; Taylor Hanrath, Manager of Capital Works; and myself attended the Killaloe, Hagarty and Richards Council meeting. Staff discussed speeding issues and pedestrian crossings on County Roads. Council was provided with the following Corporate Policies:

- PW-01 Roadway Classification and Design,
- PW-14 Pedestrian Crossings and Hiking Trail Crossings on County Roads, and
- PW-17 Enhanced Traffic Warning Devices.

5. Summer Students

I would like to acknowledge and extend appreciation to our seven summer students who assisted and supported the Public Works and Engineering Department staff throughout the summer.

Three Junior Engineering Technicians (Lucas Scheuneman, Wesley Peever, and Andrew Wren) were employed at the County Administration Building and had the opportunity to gain experience in the preparation of tenders and overseeing construction roadwork.

In addition, four students were employed at our Patrol Garages as Student Labourers (Bradley Quade – Southwest Patrol; Tristan Dorion – Goshen Patrol; William Sullivan – White Water Road Patrol; and, Brendan Lynch – Cobden Patrol) providing valuable assistance with roadside cleanup and maintenance.

All students have returned to school for the upcoming year to further their education.

6. Renfrew County Supervisors Roadeo

The local Renfrew County Supervisors Roadeo was held in Petawawa on September 7, 2023 showcasing the talented operators that not only the County of Renfrew has, but all partner Municipalities are fortunate to have in their organizations. The top three out of forty-two contestants were County of Renfrew Operators. The top two, Ryan Fraser (Goshen Patrol) and Gerry Phanenhour (Southwest Patrol), will be representing the Renfrew County Association at Clinton, Ontario in the provincial Roadeo on September 20, 2023.

American Public Works Association PWX 2023 Report

From August 26 to August 30, 2023, the Director of Public Works and Engineering had the pleasure of attending the American Public Works Association (APWA) PWX 2023 in San Diego, California. This years theme "Connecting the World Through Public Works", provided a first-class multi-modal learning experience designed for professionals at all levels and across the entire spectrum of public works and engineering. Of note this was the first year all electric shuttles were used to move participants to and from event sites. Over 9,000 delegates were in attendance with nearly 1,000 new participants. During the conference and exhibition, the Director of Public Works and Engineering attended a number of educational sessions as well as meetings related to the Canadian Public Works Association and the Winter Maintenance Sub-Committee.

- a) Canadian Public Works Association (CPWA) This meeting is a Board of Directors for the CPWA and representation from all participating provinces were present. This group has been developed for advocacy at a federal level. Public Works officials have met and discussed issues related to infrastructure in Canada with officials in Ottawa on a semi-annual basis.
- b) Winter Maintenance Subcommittee This meeting is a group of snow and ice control professionals from across North America with a mandate to provide training to agencies throughout North America and liaison with many organizations and groups in the field of transportation.
- c) Exhibition Showcase Over 300 vendors were present on the exhibition floor with everything from Advanced Drainage Systems to Zonar Systems represented. Everything public works was shown to improve efficiency and effectiveness for the delivery of services.
- d) National Equipment Roadeo This was an opportunity for the most skilled operators in American and Canada to compete against each other in friendly competition.
- e) Canadian Public Works Luncheon The New Board of Directors announced Scott Lamont of Rossland, B.C. as this years President with Lee Perkins from the County of Renfrew being President Elect.
- f) Drones for Large Scale Public Works Projects' Asset Inspection and Condition Assessment. Basically a sales pitch for a particular vendor for their UAV product, although the concept of a drone being used to survey bridge condition, would be of benefit for the County.
- g) Integrating Design into the Design-Build Process: San Diego International Airport How to use design-build in a team environment to create efficiencies as opposed to the design-bid-build process. This has been a success story to date.
- h) Unlocking the Promise of CAV Technology: The Ottawa Experience Connected and autonomous vehicles (CAV) are coming. This was a presentation by two City of Ottawa officials who provided a Canadian perspective to CAV's on how to leverage funding and the safety aspects autonomous vehicles will bring to traffic operations into the future.

- i) Staying Ahead of the Curve Pavement Preservation: Theory, Concept and Strategies The strategies for pavement preservation and making taxpayer dollars go further was the subject matter. This presentation certainly gave credibility to the County of Renfrew's current Asset Management Plan and how the Public Works and Engineering Department uses pavement preservation techniques to maintain the roadway system.
- j) Updating Google Street View An excellent and informative session on how an end user can update Google Street View using very simple techniques.

RESOLUTIONS

1. McMahon Road Culvert County Structure Assumption Request

Recommendation: THAT the Operations Committee recommends that the replacement of McMahon Road Culvert, on McMahon Road, 0.18km east of Ferguslea Road, Township of Admaston/Bromley be approved to be included in and proceed under the 2023 Capital Budget in the estimated amount of \$100,000 for the County portion of the project costs.

Background

In early May, County staff were made aware of a culvert in a failed state condition under McMahon Road, 0.18km east of Ferguslea Road, Township of Admaston/Bromley. The culvert is not a County Structure; however, it does have a span of 3m. At the June meeting of County Council, Resolution OP-CC-23-06-77 was passed as follows:

"THAT County Council approve the assumption of McMahon Road Culvert on McMahon Road, 0.18km east of Ferguslea Road, Township of Admaston/Bromley; AND FURTHER THAT costs for design and construction on McMahon Road Culvert be shared equally between the County of Renfrew and the Township of Admaston/Bromley; AND FURTHER THAT staff be directed to complete the design for the replacement of McMahon Road Culvert and present 2023 budget implications at a future meeting."

The design for McMahon Road Culvert has now been completed by the County staff and has been shared with staff of the Township of Admaston/Bromley for approval to proceed. It is currently estimated that the overall replacement can be completed for less than \$200,000, including design and construction, which would be shared equally between the County and the Township. In an effort to expedite the project and realize savings, the County would proceed with replacement utilizing the County Day Labour Construction forces. As McMahon Road Culvert is in a failed state condition it requires replacement this year.

BY-LAWS

2. County Road 512 (Foymount Road) Road Widening

Recommendation: THAT the Operations Committee recommends to County Council that a Bylaw be adopted to acquire property described as part of Lot 26, Concession 14, Part 6 on Plan 49R-20186 in the geographic Township of Sebastopol, Township of Bonnechere Valley, from

Andrew Leight and Sally Leight for the sum of Two Thousand Dollars (\$2,000); AND FURTHER THAT the property described be dedicated as part of the public highway upon registration of the transfer documents.

Background

In support of the reconstruction of County Road 512 (Foymount Road), the County entered into an Option to Purchase Agreement with this property owner following the finalization of their recent property purchase within the project limits. The road widening land to be transferred to the County of Renfrew is identified as part of Lot 26, Concession 14 in the Geographic Township of Sebastopol, Township of Bonnechere Valley and is described as Part 6 on Plan 49R-20193, which is attached as Appendix CW-I.

BY-LAW NUMBER

A BY-LAW TO ACQUIRE LAND COUNTY ROAD 512 (FOYMOUNT ROAD)

WHEREAS under Section 6(1) and Section 8 of the Municipal Act, S.O. 2001, c.25, as amended, a municipality may pass by-laws to acquire land;

AND WHEREAS under Section 5(3) of the Act, the County of Renfrew's capacity, rights, powers and privileges must be exercised by By-law;

AND WHEREAS under Section 31(6) of the Act, if a municipality acquires land for the purpose of widening a highway, the land acquired forms part of the highway to the extent of the designated widening;

AND WHEREAS the County Operations Committee has reviewed and approved the transfer of the land described, for the purpose of road reconstruction.

NOW THEREFORE the Council of the Municipal Corporation of the County of Renfrew hereby enacts as follows:


- 1. THAT the Corporation of the County of Renfrew acquire the lands described as part of Lot 26, Concession 14, Part 6 on Plan 49R-20193, in the geographic Township of Sebastopol, Township of Bonnechere Valley, from Andrew Leight and Sally Leight for the sum of Two Thousand Dollars (\$2,000).
- 2. THAT the lands are hereby dedicated as part of the highway namely County Road 512 (Foymount Road) immediately upon registration of the transfer documents.
- 3. THAT this By-law shall come into force and take effect upon the passing thereof.

INFORMATION

1. Summer Operations

a) Shouldering Program

The shouldering program is progressing well with works in all participating patrols anticipated to be completed by October 2023.

b) Small Culvert Program

The small culvert inventory and inspection program is progressing well with staff performing this work. It is anticipated that the updates for 2023 will be completed by the end of October.

c) Crack Sealing Program

The cleaning and sealing of unroutered cracks in hot mix asphalt pavement of County Roads 16 (Victoria Street), 21 (Beachburg Road), 1 (River Road) and 62 (Combermere Road) commenced on August 28, 2023 and was completed on September 1, 2023.
